

Forestry Best Management Practices for Vernal Pools

A workshop for foresters, loggers, and other natural resource professionals.

This workshop is designed to provide foresters and loggers with the information and field experience needed to recognize and protect vernal pools and the animals that call them home. Become the expert landowners can depend on for information and advice about these valuable habitats. A field session will include a “hands-on” organism identification session, where participants will visit vernal pools and learn to recognize frogs, salamanders, amphibian egg masses, and other vernal pool organisms.

Directions: Arnot Teaching and Research Forest

From the North (Ithaca): Take NY Rt. 13 South. Approximately 4 miles from the intersection of Routes 13, 34, & 96, turn left at the intersection of Rt. 13 & Trumbulls Corners Rd. before the Newfield Post Office. Turn right on Main St. First left past the Baptist Church, onto VanKirk Rd. Approximately 4 miles, bear to the left at the Irish Hill Rd. intersection. 3 miles to the steep driveway on the right.

From the Southwest (Elmira, Horseheads): Take NY Route 13 North from Horseheads, turning right onto NY 224 at Alpine Junction. Approximately 6 miles, left on County Rt. 13. 1.4 miles to the steep driveway on the left, just after the gate to the Arnot Forest (also on the left).

Directions to Amboy: From Oswego: Take Rt. 104E to its end in Altmar. Turn right onto Rt. 13. Follow instructions “from Pulaski.” **From Parish:** Take Rt. 69 East for 9 miles into Amboy Center. Turn left onto Rte. 183. Go north for 4 miles. Parking lot is on the right. **From Pulaski:** Take Rt. 13 southeast into Williamstown. Turn right onto Rt. 183. Go south for 1 mile. The parking lot is on the left. (The property begins at the wall of pine trees.) **From Syracuse:** Take 81 north to Parish, Exit 33 for Rt. 69. Follow instructions “from Parish.” **From Rome:** Take State Route 69 West all the way into Williamstown. Turn left onto St. Rte. 183. Drive 1 mile, entrance is on the left. (The property begins at the wall of pine trees.)
